Construction Update

Parking

Beginning **March 6**, the paved lot in front of The Children's Hospital will close, and **physician and resident parking will move** to the first floor of the Ninth Avenue garage, which will have gated entryway. No Sacred Heart associates will be able to park in the garage – including nightshift and those with tags.

To offset the loss of parking areas due to construction, a new paved parking lot will be constructed on the east side of the Ninth Avenue parking garage. The nearby garden has been dismantled to make room for the new parking lot. The rock statue is being moved, and the garden shed has been donated to the University of West Florida for use in their garden.

Entrance Closure

Also on March 6, the entrance to The Children's Hospital and Sacred Heart Maternity and Women's Center will close. Everyone accustomed to entering through Children's/Women's will need to access the hospital through the Main Hospital or Medical Office Building entrances. The associate shuttle will continue to drop off near the Medical Office Building entrance.

Patients may park in the Ninth Avenue parking garage, enter through the Main Hospital or Medical Office Building entrances and proceed towards the Children's/Women's lobby. During construction, valet services will relocate near the Main Hospital entrance and extend hours to 7:30 a.m. – 6 p.m. Extra signage is being added to our campus, and staff members will be ready to provide directions and transport patients.

Children's Hospital Receives Grant

The Children's Hospital has received a \$13,300 grant from Mattel Inc. in partnership with the Children's Hospital Association. The grant will be used to purchase three Vecta Deluxe Mobile Sensory Stations, which are designed to make the hospital experience more fun and calming for autistic children by offering:

- Stereo that can play a child's favorite music via radio station, CD or connection to an iPhone, iPad or iPod
- Interactive bubble column that has a continuous flow of calming bubbles and smooth transitions between vibrant colors, as well as the ability for children to pick the color and control the flow of bubbles
- Projector to display vibrant images on the walls or ceiling
- 100 fiber-optic "tails" that cycle through colors and provide a distraction for children to braid or comb with their fingers
- Aromatherapy diffuser with essential oils and an adjustable fan
